Dr. Bill Seals gave a talk on Pigeon Fever, or Dry Land Distemper, at the Nov. general meeting. There are many cases of Pigeon Fever in and around our area now.

I, Christine Amber the Newsletter Chair, live in Gilroy on Roop Rd. I have 13 horses at my place, and I have one case of it. Dr. Toews, my neighbor, treated the horse here.

Although Pigeon Fever is not contagious or spread from horse-to-horse contact, it is infectious and spread by flys biting an infected horse and transmitting it to a second horse. There isn't a rhyme or reason about which horses get it. Your best prevention is fly prevention and control. If you have a horse with an open, draining abcess, make sure you have your veterinarian prescribe the most effective treatment. Some horses require
