Our SMHA Pleasure Trails committee is asking for your feedback regarding the plans for our November Pleasure Trail Ride. Feedback will help us know your interest level & plans to participate so we can better plan and implement the ride(s) at Sunol on November 14th.

Melanie Headrick is the contact for this ride, 408-593-7872. Ride cancels for rain, Melanie will cancel Friday night before or it is a GO.

Location: Sunol Regional Park - www.ebparks.org/parks/sunol#reach Park use fees and/or special permit fees apply. Space for only 10 rigs. Members only, but remember anyone can join at the ride.

Meet

at 8:30 at Target parking lot in Morgan Hill to Horse Trailer Pool and Caravan. or at 10am at Sunol Regional Park.

Directions to Target: 101 to Morgan Hill Cochrane exit. Exit East. Left at first intersection in Target Center, near Red Robin and Starbucks. Coffee anyone? Lots of room.

Directions to Sunol: North on 101 to North 680, through Fremont, over the Sunol grade (not out of Milpitas), exit at Calaveras Rd (just before 84), Right on Calaveras Rd. to Left on Geary, to the Park. Pay at the Kiosk. Drive 1/2 mile and Right into gravel parking lot by the horse stables. Space for only 10 rigs.

- Judy Etheridge is leading the long ride -(moderate to difficult climbs geared to the least conditioned horse and rider)
- Linda Evans is leading the short ride (moderate climbs geared to the least conditioned horse and rider). Water for people and a lunch.

Dress in layers, cold on the top of the hill.

Bring: Water for yourself and a sack lunch. A wicking, breathable, cover for a sweaty horse.

Horse and Rider Safety Tips for the Trail

Least experienced horses and/or riders behind the lead rider.

Know who has the first aide-kits for horses and people. When the trail is on a steep hillside, if your horse gets bothered, face him toward the edge of the trail Few horses will step off the hillside frontwards, many will step backwards off a trail.

Never let too much distance get between horses who want to be near friends, never get closer than a kicks length.

Know who has phone numbers for ranger, base camp, staging area, etc.

Wear a medical alert, ID or an armband. This is especially important if you have had a fall and a concussion. Note: your "who to call if number", your insurance info, blood type, allergies, previous recent head injuries, medications, etc.

If your horse is very long haired, he will have difficulty staying cool and can easily overheat,--watch for excessive heavy breathing-- let horses catch their breath. Better yet, have someone check pulse and respiration rates (P&R's) if your are concerned.

If your horse is very sweaty after the ride and it is chilly, cover him with a wool army blanket or a wicking polyester blanket. If the material doesn't wick, the horse can't dry off, if the material doesn't insulate when it is damp, it is another layer that makes your horse cold.

Survey for All Horse People

The American Horse Publications (AHP) is conducting an Equine Industry Survey to gauge participation trends in the U.S. equine industry. In addition, the survey seeks to gather information regarding the most important issues facing the industry.

C. Jill Stowe, PhD, is providing consulting services for data collection and analysis to the AHP. Stowe is an assistant professor of Agricultural Economics at the University of Kentucky.

The survey is sponsored by Intervet/Schering-Plough Animal Health and Pfizer Animal Health.

Those eligible to participate in the survey are men and women, 18 years of age and older, who currently own, manage, or lease at least one horse and live in the United States.

American Association for Horsemanship Safety Clinic

I want to share about a clinic that I held at my place that was advertised in The Eventer. I have been a member of American Association for Horsemanship Safety (AAHS) since 1994. When I started accepting money and charging for training and teaching, I wanted to have some way to measure my skills. I found several organizations at that time, Certified Horsemanship Association, CHA, AAHS and American Riding Instructors Association (ARIA).

To date, I've been through the certification programs of CHA, ARIA, US Eventing Association, and now AAHS.

AAHS was a very intensive certification clinic. The organization has it's basis in equine negligence law, having been co-founded by attorneys Robert and Jan Dawson. Robert was a professor at the law school of University of Texas. Jan is an author of such books as, Teaching Safe Horsemanship (1997,2003) and Secure Seat (2004). Both books are widely accepted in the equestrian world and required or recommended reading for USDF, USEA and other USEF recognized organization certification programs.

The clinic was five days and focused on negligence law as it applies to horses and the Secure Seat method of teaching. The Secure Seat method has been tested through research and if followed, is a very defensible teaching method.

Nothing can prevent a true accident, but preparation can help insulate horse professionals and horse owners from lawsuits. Preparation can help us understand how to help our attorney build a positive defense in the event of an accident.
