What is: Team Penning, Team Sorting or Ranch Sorting?

If you are a little unclear about team penning and sorting -- the topic of our February general meeting and the focus of our March general meeting, **you are not alone**. Perhaps these descriptions can help you "sort" it out!.

Team Penning-- a fast-paced, timed competitive event where a team of three riders separate three numbered cattle out of a herd, and chase or herd them into a three-sided pen at the opposite end of the area. Of course, places that are beginner friendly start this at a slow pace that allows riders to practice moving the cattle with their horses.

Team Sorting (may be called Ranch Sorting)--



a team event of two, three or four riders that move and sort cows from one end of an arena to the other end and across a finish line at the other end. All of the cattle are numbered, usually with a large sticker glued to their rumps. The sort begins when the

announcer calls a particular number. The cattle are moved in a numerical sequence, beginning with the called number, until all cattle are moved across the finish line.

Another variation of sorting is when the team "sorts" the particular numbered cattle through various gate obstacles in the arena, with the ending result being that certain numbered cattle are sorted to the opposite end of the arena, through the gates and across a line or into a pen. The event may be timed or have a time limit. Again, beginner friendly activities focus on the fun of learning to sort the cows, with less emphasis on the time.

Riders of all ages and levels of experience may find that team working-cow horse sports are great for exercise and training. Through time and practice, horses can learn the fundamental cow sense that truly makes this a fun and active sport.

Host organizations, such as PPSA or Monterey Posse, determine specific rules and levels of competition. Some have sanctioning organizations and others are just casual fun events. There may or may not be cash prizes and awards. Fees and rules vary from one venue to another.

We'll pass on information about places and organizations in our area that offer penning & sorting activities. We are aware of PPSA, Monterey Sheriffs Posse and the Viera Ranch. Santa Clara County Parks Equestrian Use Survey Meeting Summary

(Thank-you Janice!)

Large attendance of over 125 people. A bit hard to hear everything (microphones next meeting). Covered summaries they sent out, and took input. Jan H. park Commissioner was there (he is a great commissioner always involved).

Intro - Elish mentioned that equestrian use is not going away, and they support SCCPR including trail watch, and impressively equestrian volunteers appear at almost every volunteer event (probably got to thank Kitty M for that she goes to absolutely everything!). Have designer that is on Monterey Bay Horse Park. 4 million park visitors trails is the most frequent used aspects of SCCPR.

Review Survey - Lee project Consultant - results also to be posted on web (read them) www.parkhere.org. The goal is to design the right facility in right location on SCCPR property close to population that is served.

Equestrian Use is a growing not dying activity [Author's note: This is key for SCCPR to admit, as demographics of response might imply otherwise]. Main thing isn't bells and whistles it's good basics - quality care and feed, close to home, trails. Multi-discipline arena--

Note: Older age brackets major responders - SCCPR feel may be 2 reasons - those that have time to respond; and truly older demographic as people into horses when younger then return to horses when have money, time, careers and less family responsibilities. It is clear from survey this is a "lifestyle".

Discussion - Things to add to summary

- Facility needs quality rental string many people get into horses that way and serves general public.
- Lessons compatible facility (also serves general public)
- · Arena lights
- Trail head
- Trailer parking/storage (important for safety aspects)
- More than one entry access in (important for safety aspects)
- Suggestion county is big and it might be better to have a few facilities not just one.
- Camping model Jack Brook
- Carriage driving

Where is money coming from to do this? Will it support itself? Who will manage? Elish mentioned they may partner with other

agencies, etc. (OSA suggested). SCCPR ,ay have concessionaire (depends on plans)

Why is Grant Ranch not in use? Concern (from Audience) environmental restrictions too tight.

Suggested SCCPR consider helping private stable facility support via Williamson Act etc.

People asked will a new facility be ready by the time Calero Stable shuts down - NO. (Scoping alone will take this year.....) Note: Calero will still be a park with trails open to horses even without stable.

It was mentioned that it isn't understand who insisted on closing Calero stable - a bit of SCCWater District and SCCParks Rec and Calero Stables finger pointing ensued. (Note: Calero Stables is a SCCWD lease to SCCPR). Calero Stables mentioned all they did to comply with water concerns and how well it is working (which no one denied). In the '92 Calero draft master plan it suggested moving stable site (when reservoir was to be raised) onto property on other side of McKean. Elish to review again.

Next steps - Looking at trends in more depth. Elish to present info to Park Commission in April. Everyone will be notified of further meetings. For more information: contact Elish Ryan 408.355.2236 elish.ryan@prk.sccgov.org

Question: My horse is afraid of cows and has never been to the beach, what should i do?
